Clipper Publishing Corp. – publishers of *The Clipper Weekly* and *The Lac du Bonnet Clipper* – is pleased to announce Mark T. Buss is the new head of the company, recently purchasing the controlling shares of long time owner/ president Kim MacAulay. With the purchase, Buss and his wife Jann Perry – who will take on some of the weekly administrative duties – assume 100 per cent ownership of the company and plan to continue growing the regional newspaper, publishing and commercial print business.

grow." MacAulay purchased *The Clipper Weekly* and its assets in 1999 and moved the Anola company to Beausejour. From there she grew the business into a respected print media organization serving Springfield, Beausejour and surrounding areas as a member of the Manitoba Community Newspaper Association (MCNA).

Over time, MacAulay went on to become the president and chairperson of the MCNA. A member of the national NewsMedia Canada board as an independent community newspaper representative, she was president throughout the creation of AdCanada Media Inc. serving community newspapers across western Canada.
